Learn from the Masters

Legends will celebrate Bunny Williams and Suzanne Rheinstein as LCDQ's first "Living Legends" honorees. Both designers will be fêted during the opening celebration at Fig & Olive on the evening of Tuesday, May 7. On May 8 at 11 a.m., Williams will be in conversation with *Elle Decor's* Whitney Robinson at Dragonette Ltd., preceded by a book signing of Williams's latest tome, *Love Affairs with Houses*. Rheinstein will appear with Jill Waage of *Traditional Home* at Jonas on Thursday, May 9, at 11 a.m.

Who better than Peter Shire, a Los Angeles native, irreverent creative force, and the lone American originally affiliated with the Memphis Group, to catalyze a discussion about the relativity of taste? Interior designer Oliver M. Furth and Sean Yashar of communication agency The Culture Creative will present "Peter Shire: Good Taste" at the Farrow & Ball flagship showroom. Shire, Furth, and Yashar will offer an artist and curator tour of the installation on Tuesday, May 7, at noon. This temporary exhibition is part of the duo's ongoing Furth Yashar & curatorial project, and is open to the public through May 11.
